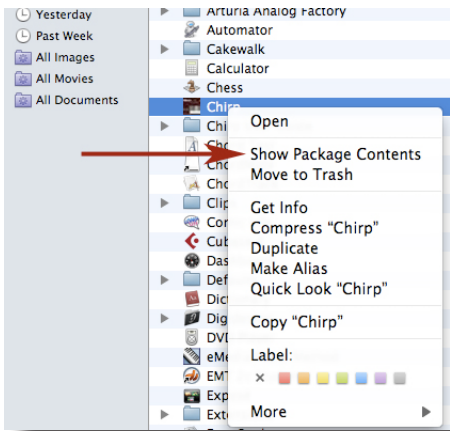


Changing the Default Settings in Chirp Mac OS X Version

Many users ask us how they can change the start-up settings of the Chirp Virtual MIDI Keyboard Controller for Mac without having to load a settings file each time. This application note provides an overview of how to accomplish this. Unlike the Windows OS where the default settings file is easily accessible to overwrite with a user's custom setup file, the Mac OS makes this a tad more difficult. Basically - we'll dig down into the Chirp application package to get to the Settings folder. We'll overwrite this settings file inside with a custom setup and saved with the same file name.



Run the Chirp application and save to the Desktop your preferred settings - call the file **Default-FactorySettings.vkbs**.

Click on **Finder** and look for the Chirp application in the **Applications** folder. Right click and choose **Show Package Contents**.

You will see another Chirp application - right click this and choose **Show Package Contents** again. Another Chirp application will appear as shown in the picture below - again right click on this and select **Show Package Contents**. When you reach the lowest Chirp sub-application, you will see a folder called **Settings** containing a file called **DefaultFactorySettings.vkbs**.

Drag the settings file you saved to your Desktop and replace the file inside the Chirp Settings folder. When you load Chirp, your preferred settings will be loaded.
